## Training Announcement

### *Non-Destructive Entry for Law Enforcement*

The Michigan State Police Training Academy is hosting a four-day training on non-destructive lawful entry (NDE) methods, an alternative option to a forced entry. Techniques such as lock picking can allow law enforcement members a covert and NDE method. NDE can be appropriate and helpful for welfare checks, community caretaker functions, suspicious circumstances, search warrants, a tactical option, covert entries or even a home lockout. Forced entry is the most expensive and least efficient method of entry.

This course is taught by Keith Wuotinen who is a lieutenant with Novi Police Department as well as a practicing litigation attorney. He will introduce participants to basics on NDE, including lock-picking techniques, bumping, and bypass methods with more than 300 locks. Participants will practice on residential and commercial locks, padlocks, deadbolts, knob locks, lever handled locks, tubular locks and mortise cylinders. Professional lock picking set/other tools will be provided.
